INTRODUCTIONS: President Chorneyko introduced and welcomed special guests.

ORDER OF DISCUSSIONS:

CAO Education:

- Education lacking for CAOs.
- o 2 year diploma program may help that; SUMA working on establishing.
- o Recognize that we are short of CAOs in the Province.
- o Practical education is key but difficult to do.
- Education is important but hands on is most important for any career/education. Learning on the job is the most valuable.
- o On the job training is most valuable and the way to learn.
- Mentoring is difficult for current administrators to fit into their already busy schedules.
- Internship program could be beneficial with funding tied to it.
- Encourage rearranging/restructuring municipalities to help with administration – joint administration?
- o Gov't has seen a slight increase in joint administration.
- A lot of municipalities do not operate at full time, sometimes just one day a week.
- Gov't legislation has changed recently to allow for districts to be established.
- o Regional cooperation is important and cost effective.

- Administrators encouraged to use Targeted Sector funding.
- The challenges of regionalization are willingness to participate in the region.

Administrative Governance Challenges

- Yes there is an increase in complaints respecting municipal governance, although a lot of times the public does not understand the role of council, etc.
- o Encourage to inform the public and be transparent.
- Mandatory education for Councilors? Gov't? SUMA?

<u>Infrastructure Programs</u>

- o Another ICIP intake in the process
- o Infrastructure programs are currently good
- Per capita funding can be favorable for many smaller municipalities.
- o MEEP Grant was popular.

Advisory Services – Scope & Role

- o Colleen is retiring
- o Judy Kanak new manager
- Staff changes
- o Looking for legal advice/opinion from staff.
- Acts do not allow this as it is no longer prescriptive but rather permissive.

Province Working on Developing a Board of Revision

- The Province is working on developing a Provincial Board of Revision.
- Development Appeal Boards will be in demand as well, with private companies getting out of the business.
- o Provincial Board of Revision will be established for 2023.
- Training will be offered for Board of Revisions and secretaries.
- o 2022 will be a challenging year for municipalities.

Covid-19

- Province wide restrictions. Why are we still here?
 Understand the cities' challenges, but so many smaller rural municipalities numbers are down.
- o The unknown is difficult to determine what happens next.
